Could my chronic pelvic pain be caused by gonadal varicose veins?

To find out, your gynecologist will first rule out other treatable conditions with a comprehensive pelvic exam.

Since bulging ovarian veins are relieved when lying down for a pelvic exam, your provider will order a pelvic ultrasound with valsava (bearing down). When bearing down, the veins will become apparent and a positive diagnosis can be made. (If you have had an abdominal and pelvic CT Venogram, that test can be used instead of this exam.)

What is pelvic congestion syndrome?

Pelvic congestion syndrome is the second leading cause of chronic pelvic pain, after endometriosis, in women. Like varicose veins in the legs, pelvic congestion syndrome is related to malfunctioning valves within the pelvic veins.

Valves in these pelvic veins normally allow blood to flow towards your heart. When the veins become weakened or the valves do not close properly, the blood can flow backwards toward the pelvis. Blood in the weakened pelvic veins pools, causing the veins to bulge and push against nearby structures. This can result in pain and pressure in the uterus, ovaries, vulva and back.

What are the symptoms of chronic pelvic pain?

Chronic pelvic pain associated with pelvic congestion is usually felt in the lower abdomen and lower back. You may experience:

- Deep pelvic pain when sitting or standing
- Pelvic pain that worsens throughout the day
- Bulging veins on the vulva, buttocks or thighs
- Painful/irregular menstrual cycles
- Pelvic pain during/after intercourse
- Irritable bladder
- Lower abdominal and back pain

What is GVE?

Gonadal Vein Embolization is a minimally invasive, nonsurgical treatment for pelvic congestion syndrome. The procedure seals off problematic veins, preventing them from enlarging with blood. Healthier veins take over.

GVE is performed by an interventional radiologist, a board-certified and fellow-ship trained physician. During the outpatient procedure, your physician makes a tiny incision in the groin or neck. Guided by real-time X-ray imaging, a catheter is directed to the faulty veins for treatment.

Tiny vascular plugs or coils with a sclerosing (ablative) agent are placed in the ovarian veins to seal off troublesome major veins. A foam sclerosing agent is used to block smaller veins. The decompressed veins no longer cause pressure or pain.

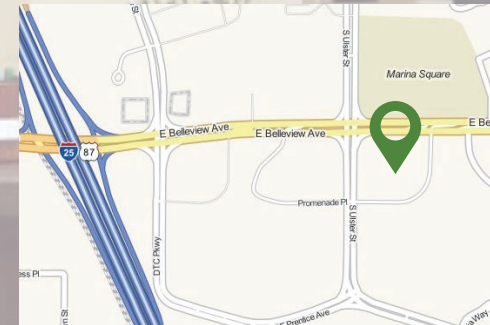

Where is GVE performed?

The gonadal vein embolization procedure will be performed in a nearby partner hospital as an outpatient procedure.

Your consultation prior to the procedure will be held at the RIA Endovascular office, located at the southeast corner of Bellevue and Ulster, just east of I-25. There is free covered and uncovered parking.
